SAN JUAN, PUERTO RICO

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2026

San Juan, the capital of Puerto Rico, is an intriguing blend of the old and the new. Founded in 1521, the city was a key port in the Spanish colonial empire, as evidenced by El Morro, the huge fortress that guards the harbor. Behind thick stone walls, Old San Juan retains its original character of blue cobblestone streets, elegant plazas and brightly colored heritage architecture. This lively center is the city's – and island's – cultural hub for museums, music, dining and more. The nearby Santurce district has emerged as the city's hippest, with unique shops, cutting-edge restaurants and trendy nightlife. Just minutes from the heart of San Juan are the iconic beaches of the Condado and Isla Verde, whose stretches of palm-fringed sands are lapped by the azure waves of the Atlantic.



DAY AT SEA

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 2026

With a day at sea, enjoy the unique opportunity to unplug and relax into the unhurried life on board. BRIDGETOWN, BARBADOS

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2026

Barbados is a sophisticated tropical beauty steeped in English heritage and enlivened by the warm Bajan culture. In the capital of Bridgetown, the well-preserved Old Town and historic Garrison district represent an impressive British legacy designated a UNESCO World Heritage site. The island's lush interior is largely covered in forest and fields of sugar cane, a source of prized rums and great colonial fortunes. Attractions include restored great houses, a wildlife preserve, the underground formations of Harrison's Cave, first-rate golfing and some 60 beaches of incredible variety. To the west are white sands and gentle azure waters. The south is the center for both nightlife and reef



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snorkeling, while the high cliffs of the southeast form a stunning backdrop for windsurfing. The windswept east coast, with its pounding Atlantic surf, is Barbados at its most rugged and wild.

SAINT-PIERRE, MARTINIQUE

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2026

Designated a “City of Art and History,” Saint-Pierre has many stories to tell. This cultural hub of Martinique was known as the “Paris of the Caribbean” until the eruption of Mount Pelée destroyed the city in 1902. At the Frank A. Perret Museum, founded by an American volcanologist in 1933, fascinating relics, photographs and film tell the history of the catastrophe and Saint-Pierre’s rebirth. Today the emerald slopes of Mount Pelée rise over the quaint seaside town, where monuments like the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Assumption were lovingly rebuilt while ruins like the Church of the Fort and the prison dungeon remain as a poignant tribute to the past. Modern Saint-Pierre offers all of the delights that draw visitors to Martinique, including a bustling market square, charming French colonial architecture, a yacht-filled harbor, and secluded beaches with exotic black sands. Divers flock here to explore the many shipwrecks in the waters offshore, further remnants of the volcanic event.



ANTIGUA

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2026

Antigua boasts an intricate coastline of bays, coves, and inlets, and a plethora of white-sand beaches. Set inside one of the island’s great natural harbors, St. John’s is the bustling capital, maritime hub and center for commerce, including a lively farmers’ and crafts market. The British left a lasting imprint on the city, from Fort James and Fort Barrington guarding the harbor entrance to the gleaming white towers of the landmark St. John’s Cathedral. Inside the 18th-century Court House, the Museum of Antigua and Barbuda showcases local history dating to the first Arawak settlements. From St. John’s, Antigua’s famous beaches, historic sights and intriguing geological formations are in easy reach. Offshore, explore colorful coral reefs, go deep-sea fishing or enjoy world-class sailing.



VIRGIN GORDA

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 20, 2026

Dramatic geology, unspoiled landscapes, quiet coves and gorgeous beaches are all part of Virgin Gorda’s appeal. Along the western ridge of the plump middle is Gorda Peak National Park, whose trails deliver stunning panoramic views. At the island’s



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southernmost tip is its most famous landmark, the Baths. Here massive granite boulders form tidal pools, grottoes and arches, and separate the white sands of Devil's Bay and Spring Bay beaches. Spanish Town and Virgin Gorda Yacht Harbour are laid-back centers of commercial and maritime activity. For a taste of local history, visit the clifftop ruins of a copper mine or Little Fort National Park, now a nature preserve. As the island stretches north, its roads end. The most exclusive resorts, restaurants and private homes are only reachable by boat, including the scenic, sheltered North Sound, popular for watersports.

GUSTAVIA

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 21, 2022

Saint Barthélemy – better known as Saint Barth – represents a special brand of Caribbean luxury. Exclusive yet unpretentious, its barefoot elegance is distinctly Gallic in style. Around a scenic harbor filled with yachts and sailboats, the tidy capital of Gustavia is a chic mix of designer boutiques, galleries, and fine restaurants serving elevated French-Caribbean cuisine. The town is an ideal base for exploring the tiny island's diverse array of white sand beaches, ranging from the tranquil natural beauty of isolated Colombier to the sleek hotels and exclusive beach clubs along Baie de St. Jean.

Relaxing and laid-back by day, Saint Barth shows its glamorous side after dark, when partiers pack the bars and the dancing lasts until dawn.

The cruise fare does not include airfare, hotel accommodations, transfers, luggage handling, shore excursions, meals ashore, specialty dining at Seta Su Ilma or Dining Privée, salon services, spa treatments or personal purchases from the boutique. Gratuities are not included for salon services or spa treatments. Select specialty champagnes, wine, spirits, and caviar are not included in the cruise fare.

Cruise cancellation requests received within 150 days of the Sailing Date will be subject to the following cancellation fees:

150 to 121 days prior to Sailing Date	cancellation fee equal to 25% of the Cruise Fare
120 to 91 days prior to Sailing Date	cancellation fee equal to 50% of the Cruise Fare
90 to 61 days prior to Sailing Date	cancellation fee equal to 75% of the Cruise Fare
60 or less prior to Sailing Date	cancellation fee equal to 100% of the Cruise Fare

If a cancellation request is received more than 150 days prior to the Sailing Date, and a deposit has already been paid on the booking, Guest will receive a full refund of the Cruise Fare less an administrative fee of \$250USD per person (the "Administrative Fee"). The Administrative Fee is non-refundable but may be

applied towards a new booking made within twelve (12) months of the cancellation date. The Administrative Fee may only be applied to one (1) new booking.
